7. **Queen's University District – Student Activities** – Chief McNeely introduced Staff Sergeant Carla Stacey, Sergeant Clem Nesanayagam and Inspector Brian Pete who provided an update with respect to the Student Activities in the Queen's University District in particular the Queen's move in weekend(s) and frosh week. Staff Sergeant Stacey reported that move-in weekend seen a total of 87 noise complaints from Tuesday to Sunday, 52 of the noise complaints were received Friday to Sunday. She reported that on September 3rd there were approximately 7000 people take over university Avenue from 11 pm to 2 am and on September 9th, the orientation concert gathered crowds of between two to three thousand and on September 10th the volume was significantly more with gatherings taking place at the Gord Downie Pier. Staff Sergeant Stacey shared new strategies in mitigating these issues before they escalate to nuisance parties focusing on messaging risks with alcohol consumption, roof top access, pedestrian traffic accidents and property damage. In addition, the Kingston Police are articulating the concerns with overtaxing emergency services. She relayed that the Kingston Police is working with Queen's University and the City of Kingston By-Law

Enforcement focusing the message of safety for all in the community and security of all residents of Kingston. The Kingston Police has released several social media messages, added information sheets to Queen's to hand out to new students and have attended Queen's Orientation Leaders Briefing. Staff Sergeant Stacey reported that the Kingston Police will be participating in a "door knock" in person messaging in the Queen's University district.
