Re: *Public Sector Salary Disclosure Act* and Funding Requirement

As you know, the Board as the employer of members of the Kingston Police is required to file a report under the subject Act whenever it meets the funding requirements set out in section 2(2) of the Act. In 2021, our organization received the following grant revenue from the Province of Ontario, putting it within the parameters for reporting under the subject Act (in this case, receiving at least \$1 million).
