Uniformed Patrol Officers

Uniformed Patrol is committed to serving the community and safeguarding the lives and property of the citizens of Kingston. Their roles and responsibilities include:

- Proactive patrol and crime prevention
- Responding to non-emergency calls
- Responding to emergency calls including crimes in progress
- Enforcement of federal and provincial law, and municipal by-laws
- Investigating complaints and criminal offences
- Traffic control and enforcement

Communications Centre

The Kingston Police Communications Centre is designated as a Primary Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP) which means that communicators answer both:

- Non-emergency calls; and
- 9-1-1 for Kingston Police, Ontario Provincial Police, Military Police, Kingston Fire and Rescue and Ambulance

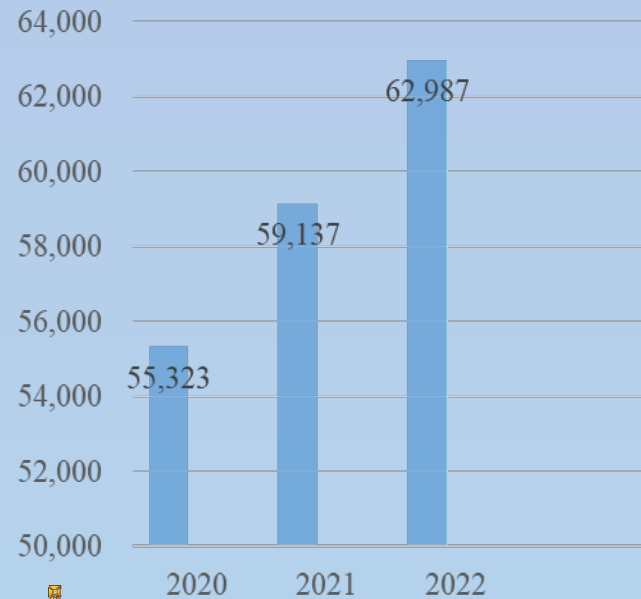

911 Calls and Calls for Service (CAD)

Computer aided dispatch (CAD) calls that require police presence to resolve, correct or assist in a situation. Communicators assign call types based on the information initially provided by the complainant. These incidents are classified as either emergency or non emergency and may change depending on police findings once officers attend the scene.

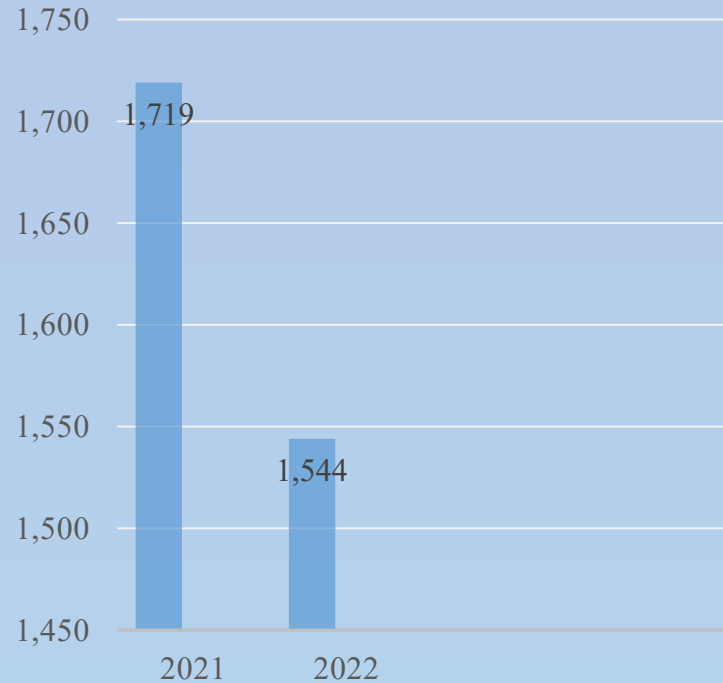

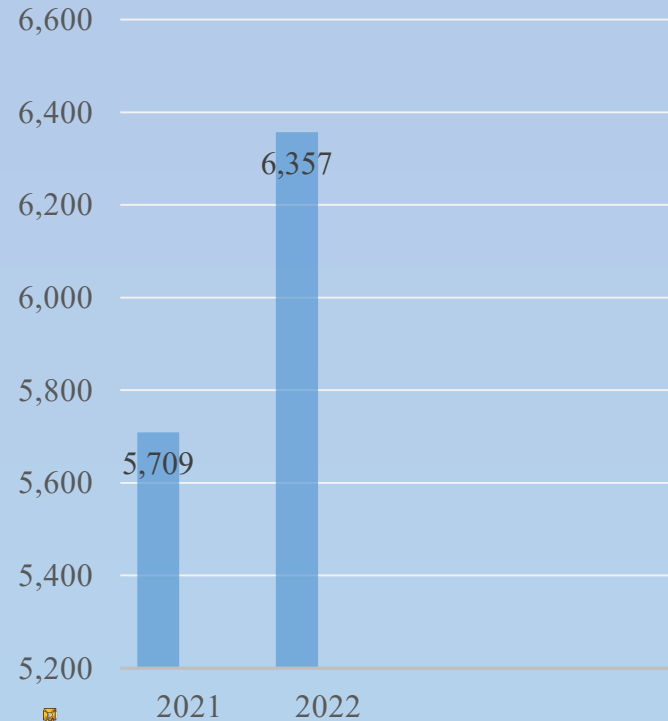

5. Theft of Vehicle

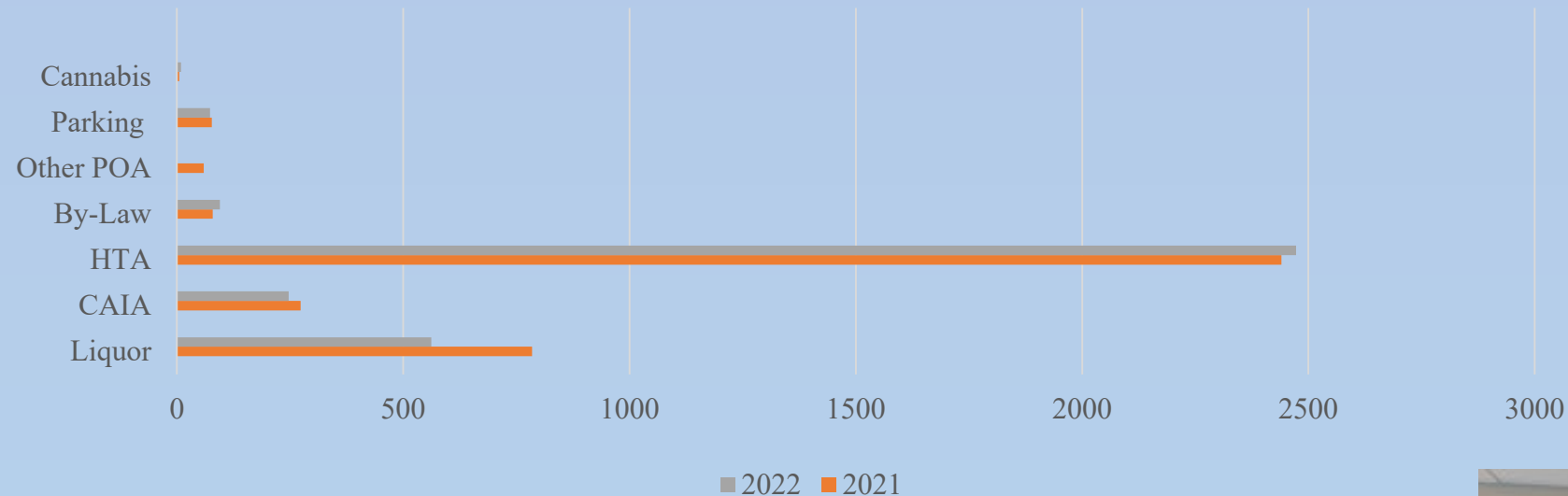

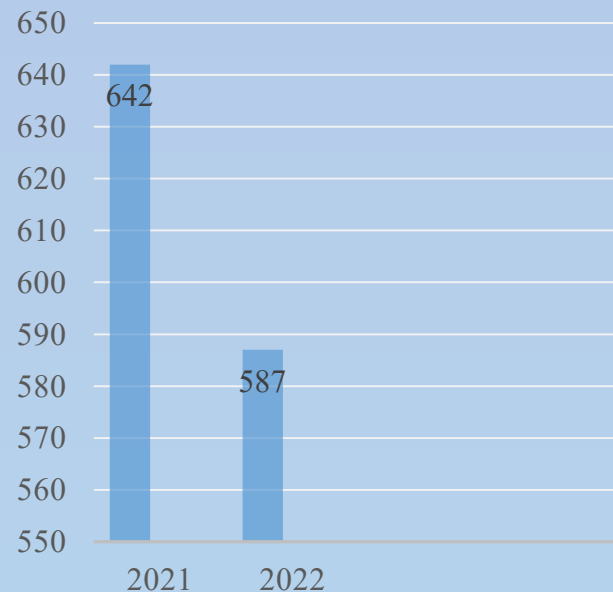

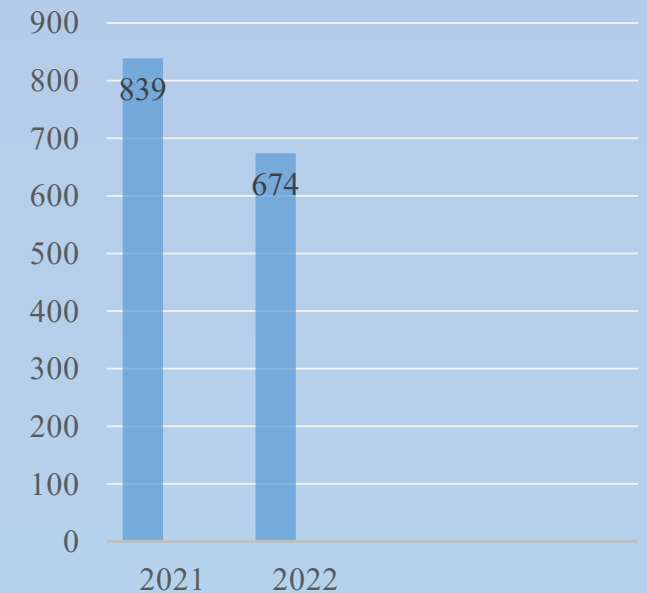
Mental Health Calls for Service

Kingston Police works under the COAST (Community Outreach and Support Team) and MCRRT (Mobile Crisis Rapid Response Team) models, the latter of which partners a mental health worker with a uniformed patrol officer.

Intimate Partner Occurrences

Refers to any conflict between two or more persons who are in an intimate relationship, whether living together or not, where, the police have been called to the scene. This includes conflicts and incidents where criminal or provincial offences have occurred. Intimate relationships do not include parent/child or sibling/sibling conflicts

In 2022, on average the Kingston Police attended 3.89 occurrences per day of Intimate Partner Violence.

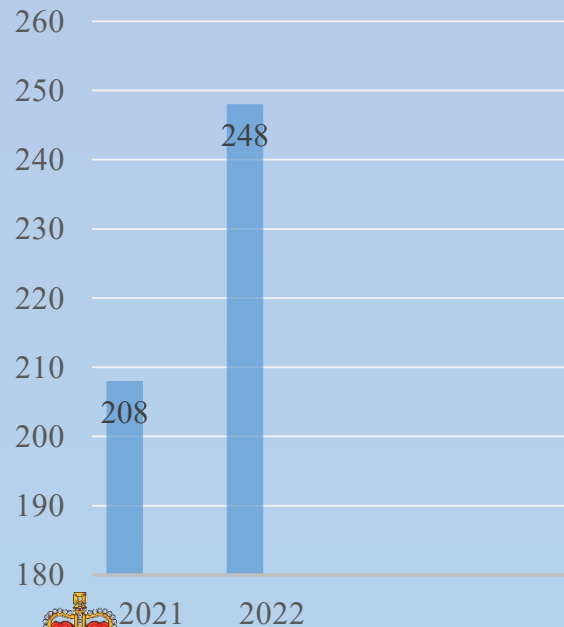

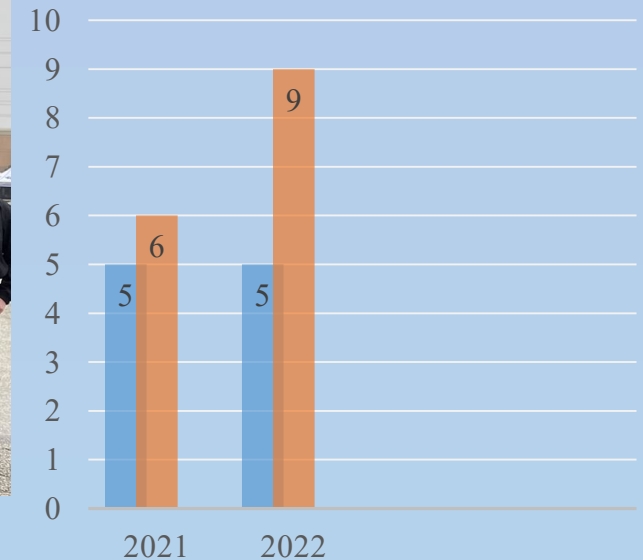
Loss of Life
