Recommendation:

That the 2025 Year-End Statistical Report, Report Number 26-04, is for information only.

Background/Analysis:

Caution should be exercised when interpreting these statistics. They represent a snapshot in time as at year-end for each year. Coding is subject to change, for it relates to investigations that are ongoing. For example, through investigation it may be determined that an allegation is unfounded or that the classification must be recoded from "Criminal Harassment" to "Harassing Phone Calls." That is, to enable a more direct comparison with 2020, statistical coding for the prior four years was not reviewed/updated.

Additionally, the cyber incident which occurred at the beginning of January 2025 has impacted our ability to accurately determine statistics for the period of November 1, 2024, through March 31, 2025. As a result, while we were able to generate some numbers, the data below is not necessarily an accurate representation of incidents during the affected time period.
